


CELL PHONE POLICY



STORE IT!

From the time you arrive at school to the time you are dismissed at the end of the day your cell phone must be stored in your locker. They are not permitted in classrooms, hallways, bathrooms, changerooms, outside at recess or anywhere other than your locker! Get a lock and use it. Don't share your combination.

CHECK IT (BRIEFLY!)







THE CONSEQUENCE

Students seen with a personal device during the school day will have it confiscated. It will be stored in the office and you must speak very nicely to Mrs. Kent to retrieve it after the final bell of the day.

OTHER TECHNOLOGY

These rules apply to other personal technology such as tablets, external speakers, gaming devices and music players as well. Apple watches may be worn during the school day if they remain in DND mode at all times.





HEADPHONES

If headphones are required for in class work they need to be wired with a 3.5mm jack.

BE KIND

There may be times you will be directed by a teacher to use your device for classroom activities or assignments. It is expected that you will stay on task. Know that you may be questioned by well meaning school staff as to why you have your phone on you!

Respond nicely and let them know which teacher or class you are in so they can confirm.


Parking Lot Safety

For those families that are new to Graminia it is important to note that our parking lot is a **one-way street**. The entrance is at the South and the exit is at the North. It helps us to keep everything safe when traffic flows in this direction. In order to ensure the safety of students during pick-up and drop-off we would ask you to follow the following rules:

- If dropping off students in the lane closest to the school, please park in a parking stall following all traffic rules. No dropping off in this lane without correctly parking (**no drop** and roll).
- If dropping off students in the grass/gravel lane (in front of the totem pole), you may drop students off without parking (drop and roll). This can only happen in this lane, not in the lane closest to the school.
- It is critically important that students, parents and staff use the crosswalk when crossing the parking lot in front of the front doors. It is not safe to cross from in between parked cars and the Parent Parking areas have cars constantly backing up and moving. As the adults, we can model this for the kids!

Thank you for your cooperation. Ms Neumann and Ms Chessor will be out to support a safe drop off and pick up each day.

Please make sure that anyone dropping your child off is aware of the rules.

To order, please register your child(ren) into the classes they are in. All families, new and returning, must register each year. Please note if this is your first time ordering, please send cutlery to school with your child(ren) as we do not provide this to them.

Orders can be placed starting on Saturday, with the cut off being firm at 1pm on Thursday for hot lunch the following week. Payment can only be received through PayPal. Payment must be received by Thursday at 1pm, for your order to be accepted. Note, that a PayPal processing fee will be added to your order.

Unfortunately, your volunteers will not be able to handle any refunds or cancellations. If your child is absent, we will accept a transfer request to another student by 10:00am on hot lunch day by email to: graminiaparentcommunity@gmail.com.
